"VIE" Grants Program Wraps Up Its Second Year and Invites Applicants for 2019

The Vian Community Foundation's "VIE – for Vian" grants program is entering its third year. The VIE program recognizes and congratulates its 2018 recipients, and seeks applicants for 2019.

"V.I.E." – Vian's Innovators and Educators – is a "mini-grants" program that funds projects benefitting Vian schools or the Vian community. Program materials describe VIE as a sort of "Booster Club" for academic, cultural, and civic projects. VIE will have \$10,000 available for grants in 2019 to fund about 8 grants to local volunteers, teachers, or community leaders. Applications are requested by June 1, 2019.

Most 2017 and 2018 grants have been for school-related projects, but VIE Committee member Michelle Traw – one of the program's sponsors and a former teacher herself -- emphasized that VIE is eager to find other types of community projects as well, for both youth and adults. VIE application materials explain that VIE's goal is to "make things happen for Vian that would not otherwise happen without VIE," especially by encouraging and funding applicants who are willing to volunteer substantial amounts of their own time to the projects.
